Supported Independent Living (SIL) is one type of help or supervision with daily tasks to help you live as independently as possible, while building your skills.

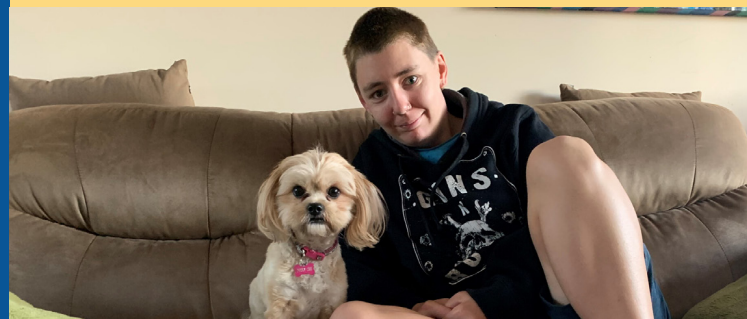

Making the decision to move out of home and live independently is a defining moment in the lives of those living with a disability. Even more so if you need support and are unable to live on your own.

Below are some FAQs that may help you.

FAQs

How many people would I be living with?

Your NDIS package will determine your living arrangements. We endeavour to match residents with like-minded people of similar age and interests.

What are the costs of SIL?

SIL is funded for eligible people by the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) under Core Supports - Assistance with Daily Life. The NDIS does not cover the cost of rent, utilities, meals and transport. These costs are paid for and shared by the residents. You will also have personal expenses & medical costs.

Can I still use the supports that I had before moving?

In most cases, yes. Caribundi will work with your other providers to ensure your needs are being met.

What happens if I get sick in SIL?

If you become ill while you are in SIL, a support worker will be rostered on to support you at home when you are unable to attend your regular daily activities such as work or day programs. They will also be available to help you attend appointments if required.
